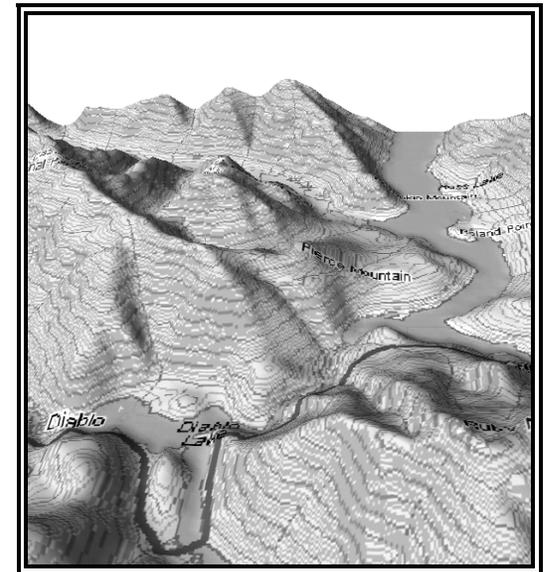

SEARCH MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS



***A PRACTICAL APPROACH TO
INITIATING AND DIRECTING
EFFORTS TO RESOLVE
MISSING PERSON REPORTS.***

DESCRIPTION & PHILOSOPHY

Search Management Systems (SMS) is an integrated, practitioner-based program of field-proven techniques and tools.

SMS seminars are based on the philosophy that all searches have a common beginning. This initial response phase might last several hours to several days. Characteristics of this phase include an emphasis on hasty searching and investigation, relatively small number of resources and agencies, a limited overhead staff, and a loosely defined search area.

Table 1 suggests that roughly 90% of searches last less than 18 hours, and very few searches extend more than 24 hours. Simply put, most searches are resolved in an initial response phase.

But regardless of how large or complex a search ends up being, the proper initial actions are identical, and crucial to success. Effective initial actions can maximize subject survivability and detection, minimize costly large searches, and establish a firm foundation for those incidents that become unusually complex.

Search Management Systems seminars focus on providing participants the tools needed to confidently make decisions to ensure effective initial actions.

SMS OBJECTIVES

Upon course completion, participants can:

- Appropriately initiate searches.
- Form, communicate, and implement effective and meaningful decisions.
- Manage and utilize crucial search management information.
- Direct searches through the initial response phase.
- Anticipate and manage changes in complexity, and set the stage for expanded response.
- Transition to a relief incident commander.

WHY SMS?

Search Management Systems seminars are unique from other search management courses because they:

- Use adult teaching techniques to optimize learning and retention.
- Focus on the key, essential components of all search incidents.
- Are ICS based.
- Teach how to manage by objectives.
- Approach search from the perspective of “missing” (rather than “lost”), thus considers other possibilities such as crime, fraud, and simple overdue.
- Are supported by a comprehensive workbook.
- Are organized and presented in a logical, integrated, and sequential process reflecting actual incident evolution.
- Incorporate ICS map symbology.
- Build team performance between participants, and emphasizes the importance of teamwork on actual incidents.
- Are current, with frequent updates and revisions. Many of these improvements originate from the experience and knowledge of seminar participants.
- Are taught by instructors with extensive search experience and proven teaching skills.
- Allow participants to practice concepts through frequent use of actual search tabletop exercises.
